Obama Panders to Illegals; Limits Immigration Raids

The Obama administration is planning to greatly reduce, if not outright eliminate, workplace immigration raids in an effort to pander to illegal alien activists.

Department of Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano has reportedly told her department to focus more on investigating employers than conducting raids.

"This is nothing more than a way to implement an amnesty for the illegals," warns U.S. Border Security Council Executive Director Brice Griffin. "The Obama administration is simply not going

to enforce the laws."

Illegal alien-loving politicians have been urging the President to stop immigration raids calling them haphazard and mean. "Raids that break up families in that way, just kick in the door in the middle of the night, taking [a] father, a parent away, that's just not the American way. It must stop," House Speaker Nancy Pelosi demanded at a Capitol Hill conference on border issues sponsored by the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.

Number of Illegal Alien Children Soars

A study by the Pew Hispanic Center reports that the number of children being born to illegal alien parents is soaring.

By being physically born in the United States these children are automatically citizens. They are often referred to as "anchor babies."

The Pew study says that there are now 4 million such kids living

in America. In 2003 the figure was 2.7 million.

One out of every fifteen children in grades Kindergarten through 12th grade have parents who were illegal aliens when the children were born.

"The anchor babies are a huge problem," explains U.S. Border

Phoenix Police Fear Growing Wave of Kidnappings

Phoenix police fear the wave of kidnappings that has made the Arizona city the kidnapping capital of the world will get worse. In 2008, 368 people were kidnapped. Most were members or relatives of rival Mexican drug gangs. Now, however, police officials worry that the kidnappings will be extending to include ordinary citizens as they do in Mexico.

Maine Might Let Non-Citizens Vote

Politicians in Maine are seriously considering allowing non-citizens the right to vote in local elections. So far the measure being considered would apply only to legal residents of the United States. However, there is little doubt that it would be ultimately be applied to illegal aliens as well.

No More Border Fence

President Barack Obama has decided that 670 miles of border fence are enough and will not fund any more physical barriers along the U.S.-Mexican border. 670 miles of the famed border fence are either built or are slated to be built along the 2,000-mile border.

More Mexican than Mexico?

More than one out of ten Mexicans now live in the United States. According to the Pew Center, 10.6% of all Mexicans who were born in their home country have left that corrupt nation and have taken up residence in the United States. That number is expected to grow.

it must stop the raids because it needs the additional funding and manpower to fight drug-related violence along the border.

“This is just another pathetic lie aimed at covering up the real purpose of this new policy,” explains Griffin. “The federal government must enforce our immigration laws and secure the border. What the President is doing will accomplish neither of these goals. What it will do is allow illegal aliens to come and work here in the U.S. without fear of being deported. That is an amnesty.”

Griffin adds that she doesn't believe that the administration is actually going to target employers, either. “The President has no intention of investigating employers of illegal aliens” she says. “His goal is to simply seem like he is

trying to control the illegal alien crisis on one hand while lobbying for a blanket amnesty to be passed by Congress.”

Members of Congress from both political parties have expressed grave reservations about this new policy. Democrat Senator Robert Byrd even blasted the proposal in an article in the *Washington Post*.

“It makes no sense to take funds from one priority (worksite enforcement) to address a new priority (the growth in border violence). This is just robbing Peter to pay Paul,” complained Byrd.

“The Obama administration is just using this policy to placate the National Hispanic Caucus until the President can figure out how to ram an amnesty bill through Congress,” Griffin says. “Everyone in Washington knows it.”

For its part the U.S. Border Security Council is already working to stop any try for amnesty. “We have a nationwide petition campaign now underway,” explains Griffin. “We plan to turn up the heat on Congress and crush any move towards passing an amnesty bill.”

Security Council Executive Director Brice Griffin. “These children are being educated and cared for largely by the U.S. taxpayer.”

Many illegal aliens deliberately travel to the U.S. to have their children. Once here they receive free medical care and their children receive a free education. Because the children are U.S. citizens, authorities often must face the difficult task of breaking up families in order to enforce immigration laws.

“They don't call these children ‘anchor babies’ for no reason. These kids help their parents stay in the country and that is wrong,” says Griffin.

“The compassionate thing to do is to not let this anchor baby scam

continue” she says. “What kind of mother uses her newborn baby to trick the system so she can steal from the taxpayers and live on the dole for the rest of her life?”

The U.S. Border Security Council supports a two-pronged approach to the anchor baby problem.

First, seal the borders and make

it so difficult for illegal aliens to come to the United States that they stop trying.

Second, enforce existing laws so that finding any type of employment is so difficult, illegal aliens find returning to their home countries with their children more palatable than remaining here.

Third, amend the U.S. Constitution so that the children of illegal aliens don't automatically become citizens.

“If we abolish all incentives to have anchor babies, then the problem will solve itself,” says Griffin. “Right now, America is essentially paying poor immigrants to sneak in and have children.”

Government Bolsters Canadian Border to Make Mexicans Happy

a conference in Washington.
