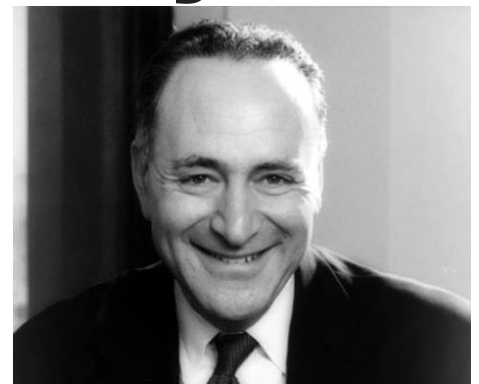
Senators Begin Drive for "Bipartisan" Amnesty Bill

U.S. Senators Chuck Schumer and Lindsey Graham have unveiled their "blueprint" for an immigration reform bill the Obama Administration plans to ram through Congress this year.

After reviewing the bipartisan proposal, U.S. Border Security Council Executive Director says the Council will oppose the measure and that it amounts to yet another proposal to grant amnesty to 11 million illegal aliens in the United States.

is yet another amnesty proposal that simply complements Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid's Senate Bill 9, called Amnesty Plus," Griffin explains. "The Council will do everything it can to defeat this latest attempt to allow illegal aliens to destroy this country."

Schumer, a Democrat from New York and Graham, a Republican from South Carolina, have been working together for months to tailor an amnesty bill that they believe

Council Scoffs at John McCain's Newfound Interest in Border Security

U.S. Border Security Council Executive Director Brice Griffin is calling U.S. Senator John McCain's attempt to portray himself as a supporter of border security a "pathetic attempt to change history and save himself from political oblivion."

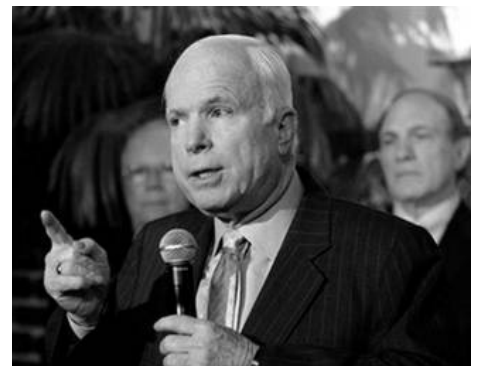
McCain, a long-time supporter of amnesty for illegal immigrants, is fighting for his political life in a primary election against fellow-Republican J.D. Hayworth and is des-

perately trying to portray himself as a tough on illegal immigration.

"John McCain is being cynical and cowardly in his quest to remain in office," Griffin says. "He has been an ardent supporter of illegal aliens and any attempt to deny that is a lie."

McCain has largely retreated from taking a public role in crafting the new amnesty bill in Congress

can be pushed through the Senate and the House of Representatives. The centerpiece of their proposal is a provision that allows illegal aliens to live in the United States legally if they pay a small fine and any back taxes they owe.

“That provision is an amnesty for lawbreakers who have brought nothing but misery to America,” Griffin explains. “What part of ‘illegal’ do these Senators not understand? As far as I am concerned, anything that doesn’t require these trespassers to return home and not profit from their crimes is an amnesty and I will oppose it. Imagine a bill that would allow bank robbers to keep their loot and stay out of jail as long as they pay taxes on the money they stole. That is what this immigration proposal is.”

instead allowing Senator Lindsey Graham, a fellow Republican and ally of McCain’s, to take the lead in crafting a “bipartisan” bill.

Recently McCain even called for sending the National Guard to patrol the border with Mexico in the wake of the brutal murder of an Arizona rancher presumably by illegal aliens. “Welcome to the party, John McCain,” laughs Griffin. “The U.S. Border Security Committee first called for the National Guards deployment in 2008! Where were you then?”

McCain is locked in a very tight primary race in which his opponent, former congressman J.D. Hayworth is making McCain infamous record on immigration issues the preeminent issue of the primary

sure. “The illegal alien lobby has a majority of Senators in its back pocket,” Griffin explains. “Our only chance in the Senate is to find forty patriots who will not allow amnesty to come up for a vote.”

Griffin says the Council is now effectively on a “war footing” and will be fighting harder than ever to defeat amnesty. “We will be calling on all our supporters across the nation to lobby their Senators and their Representatives on this issue. I believe a vote on amnesty will occur this spring or early summer. The President needs to move fast and get this through before the election season starts.”

Griffin Demands President Take Action in Wake of High Profile Border Incidents

In the wake of a number of very high-profile incidence of violence and violations of American sovereignty, U.S. Border Security Council Executive Director Brice Griffin is once again demanding that President Obama stand up for American and defend the nation's borders.

"Over the last several months violence on the U.S.-Mexico border has increased. A prominent rancher was slaughtered at his home, Mexican helicopters

have repeatedly violated our sovereign airspace and kidnappings of Americans have increased," Griffin says. "Mr. President, you have a sworn duty to protect this country. Seal the borders now."

Griffin points out that Mexico is so dangerous for Americans that many U.S. business executives must travel with heavily-armed body guards.

In Juarez, many city officials send their families to live across

the border in El Paso because they fear for their lives.

"Now, the Administration is halting work on the so-called virtual border fence," Griffin says. "Our border must be secured now. Violence is spilling over into our country. Mexico is falling into chaos and unless our federal government does something drastic and soon, America is going to follow."
