## Council Slams Foreign Government Meddling

The U.S. Border Security Council blasted a number of Central and South American Countries for joining an American lawsuit against Arizona's tough new immigration law.

Recently, a 9th Circuit Court of Appeals ruling allowed nearly a dozen Latin American countries — Mexico, Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Costa Rica, Ecuador, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Paraguay, Peru and Chile — to submit friend-of-the-court briefs in the U.S. Justice Department's challenge to Arizona's law.

"As do many citizens, I find it incredibly offensive that these foreign governments are using our court system to meddle in a domestic legal dispute and to oppose the rule of law," the Arizona governor said in a statement about the court's decision.

"The fact that these governments, who as a matter of national policy, encourage their poorest citizens to come to America illegally are involving themselves in this matter, is a scandal," says Council

## Analysis: Amnesty Battle Will Rage Throughout 2011

A preliminary U.S. Border Security Council legislative analysis reports that supporters of Amnesty Plus still retain a great deal of political power on Capitol Hill and that the battle over immigration reform will continue throughout 2011.

Despite Republican gains in November's elections, the analysis concludes that enough Democrats

and open borders Republicans will remain in Congress and they most likely ally themselves again with President Obama and will push for passage of some type of amnesty bill.

The danger is most acute in the U.S. Senate.

"Supporters of tough border security must remember that it was a Republican President and a Repub-

"The President remains committed to amnesty as do Senators like Republican Lindsay Graham and virtually all the Democrats on Capitol Hill. ## UN Report Criticizes U.S. Immigration Laws

The United Nation's Global Migration Group recently adopted a statement on the "Human Rights of Migrants in Irregular Situation" The document criticized unnamed nations for viewing illegal immigrants "through the lens of sovereignty, border security or law enforcement, sometimes driven by hostile domestic constituencies."

## Justice Department Web Page Seeks to Help Illegals

A web page on the U.S. Justice Department's web site seeks to help illegal immigrants by making it easier for them to file "discrimination" complaints against employers. The Office of Special Counsel for Immigration-Related Unfair Employment Practices offers to help workers who believe an employer has tried too hard to ascertain their legal status and their right to work in the United States.

## Mexican Government Complains About U.S. Healthcare

The Mexican Government is complaining that Mexican illegal immigrants in the United States face a higher risk of illness and death from limited access to health care in the United States. The report states that Mexican immigrants in America are more likely to become addicted to narcotics, contract AIDs or suffer from a mental illness compared to the Mexicans who live in Mexico.

## SNEAK OF THE MONTH: U.S. Senator Robert Menendez

This month's Sneak of the Month is United States Senator Robert Menendez.

Just before the Senate adjourned in October, Menendez introduced the long-awaited "Comprehensive Immigration Reform" bill the U.S. Border Security Council refers to as "Amnesty Plus."

As anticipated the bill calls for amnesty for all illegal aliens as well as many other reforms aimed at making immigration into the United

States much easier.

Menendez's bill will have to be reintroduced in 2011 for the new Congress. It's introduction was simply a cynical election year stunt aimed at Hispanic voters as well as a very serious threat from pro-illegal immigration politicians.

Their warning? "We will never give up until we pass amnesty!"

spokesman Steve LeBlanc. “This should be illegal. How America enforces our own laws is none of their business.”

The battle over Arizona’s law continues to rage as President Obama continues to attempt to undermine the law.

Polls state the law, which allows police officers to question suspects’ immigration status, remains extremely popular.

However, the direct involvement of foreign governments into the legal wrangling over the law takes the battle to a whole new level.

“Quite frankly, Council supporters should boycott these countries,” LeBlanc says. “These nation’s are trying to subvert our laws and undermine America’s sovereignty. They aren’t friends or allies of the United States.”

the first two years of the Obama Administration thanks to the help of tens-of-thousands of grassroots supporters across the country.

LeBlanc says the Council would support any legislation that bans foreign governments from participating in these types of lawsuits. “If someone in the new Congress introduces it, we will be 100 percent behind it.”

Meanwhile, LeBlanc says that Americans concerned about border security should continue the

LeBlanc says that he believes the Council can defeat any amnesty bill that the Obama Administration drafts, but that it will take a very concerted effort.

He says that the Council will begin lobbying Congress on this issue the second it comes back into town at the beginning of January. Additionally, the organization is preparing a number of grassroots campaigns that will require the participation of huge numbers of Council supporters.

“Our supporters have to be willing to keep fighting,” he explains. “We cannot let our guard down for even a second. The battle to secure our borders rages on.”

Additionally, Council supporters should lobby their state officials to support passing bills similar to the one in Arizona. Currently, there are as many as two dozen states where such legislation is being considered.

“We have to stand up for our sovereignty and for our rights to secure our borders,” LeBlanc emphasizes. “There are countries out there who want to use the United States like a garbage dump by dumping all their poor citizens and criminals on us. We must fight back.”
