## Council Vows to Fight Obama's Amnesty

The U.S. Border Security Council is vowing to fight Barack Obama's recent order illegally imposing the "Dream Act" amnesty.

"The President of the United States does not have the authority to rewrite the nation's immigration laws by executive fiat," warns Council National Spokesman Steve LeBlanc. "We are going to fight this amnesty legislatively and we will need the help of every Ameri-

can who care about border security.

Obama ordered the Department of Homeland Security to begin handing out work permits to approximately 800,000 young illegal immigrants who supposedly were brought to America when they were very young.

These individuals called "Dreamers" by the illegal alien lobby, will now be legally eligible for

## Immigration Promises to Be Huge Issues in Fall Elections


Immigration promises to be one of the most important issues in this fall's election and the U.S. Border Security Council is hoping to launch its most comprehensive voter education effort ever.

"People need to understand exactly where the candidates stand on border security and we are going to help them," says Council National Spokesman Steve LeBlanc. "So, if funding permits, we are going

to publicize the voting records of as many candidates as we can. If you are quietly for amnesty, your constituents need to know."

With so many competitive elections this fall, LeBlanc says that he is seriously considering creating a type of online voter guide for key races.

The guide would include voting records and key border security

# Border Security News in Brief

## Border Patrol Group Calls for Holder's Head

The National Border Patrol Council, which represents all 17,000 of the agency's nonsupervisory agents, called for the resignation of Attorney General Eric Holder for his role in the "Fast and Furious" operation. Council President George E. McCubbin III, described Mr. Holder's actions in the case as "a slap in the face to all Border Patrol agents who serve this country."

## Puerto Rico Asks for Washington's Help

Puerto Rico Gov. Luis Fortuno asked the federal government recently for help battling drug trafficking and violence on his island and accused the United States of favoring states over territories in the drug war. "We feel that Washington has not understood how serious our situation is," Fortuno told a House Homeland Security subcommittee.

## New Congressman Bucks Party on Border Security Vote

In his first vote as a member of Congress, U.S. Rep. Ron Barber backed a border security bill that allows Border Patrol Officers to cross public lands to pursue illegal aliens. Barber was the only Democratic House member to support the bill.

Barber was recently elected to the House of Representatives in a special election to replace Representative Gabby Giffords who was shot by a deranged left-wing activist. During the campaign Barber pledged to support tough border security.

## SNEAK OF THE MONTH: Mexican President Felipe Calderon

Mexican President Felipe Calderon is June's "Sneak of the Month" for his comments about President Obama's illegal amnesty order.

Calderon praised President Obama for taking "unprecedented" action in moving to stop deportations of young illegal immigrants brought to the United States as children.

Calderon said Obama's move took "valor and courage" and that he's sure many

massive welfare benefits including Medicaid, financial aid for college and, of course they will be allowed to work anywhere in the country.

“This is an amnesty plain and simply,” says LeBlanc. “At the moment it is a limited amnesty, but it is an amnesty nonetheless.

LeBlanc fears that the Obama’s order will gradually be expanded to the parents of these illegal aliens as well as other relatives. “Mark my words, even before the election Obama will be making exceptions to this amnesty. He’ll stop asking for proof of residency in the U.S., he’ll hand out work permits to anyone who asks for one. This is a very bad situation.”

Obama had to resort to issuing this order because the U.S. Border Security Council and a strong bipartisan coalition of Congressmen and Senators opposed the “Dream Act” and wouldn’t let it

pass through either chamber of Congress.

Recently, Republican Senator Marco Rubio began negotiating a “Republican” version of the Dream

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Act that he hoped to get passed this fall. Rubio’s actions may have encouraged Obama to simply impose the Dream Act illegally.

“This might amnesty order might not only be an election year gimmick to win over Hispanic voters,” LeBlanc warns. “It could also be

a negotiating ploy in order to get more concessions from Republicans like Rubio. Now the Dream Act is supposedly in place, if Rubio wants to pass something to appease illegals, he’ll have to get even more bolder. A general illegal amnesty is very possible.”

In any case LeBlanc says the Council will fight this illegal order. We want local and state law enforcement agencies to simply ignore this order. Obama hasn’t officially changed any laws so law enforcement should continue to enforce the immigration laws that are on the books. “Additionally, we are going to be asking our supporters across the country to pressure Congress into forcing the Administration to back down,” LeBlanc says. “We want the Congress to really stand up and be counted on this. This is no longer a border security issue. It is a constitutional one as well.

related votes each candidate made.

“This could be a very big project so I imagine we will start with key Senate races,” LeBlanc explains. “Then, as funding becomes available, we’ll move to the races for the House and maybe even some local races.”

One local race that the Council is interested in is the battle for Maricopa County, Arizona sheriff where Joe Arpaio is running for reelection.

“Arpaio’s race is already all about immigration and there are a great many false statements being made by Sheriff Joe’s opponents about illegal immigrants and Joe’s record,” explains LeBlanc. “I think

setting up some type of border security truth squad may be helpful to voters in that county.”

The Council also wants to highlight the support or opposition of various lawmakers for President Obama’s recent amnesty

# Supreme Court Set to Rule on Arizona Immigration Law

The U.S. Supreme Court is set to rule this month on the constitutionality of Arizona's popular immigration law.

At stake is an individual state's right to enforce the nation's immigration laws.

"This is major decision that could have a profound impact on border security," explains Steve LeBlanc, the U.S. Border Security Council's National Spokesman. "The state's want to be able to enforce the immigration laws, especially when the federal government either refuses to do it or doesn't do it very well.

And with this case the Obama Administration is hoping the Court will stop them..

If the High Court upholds the law LeBlanc says the Council will push for states to adopt sim-

ilar laws across the country. If the Arizona law is struck down, then the Committee will have to focus ever more on the issue of federal enforcement.

"We are hopeful the Supreme Court will rule in Arizona's favor," LeBlanc says. "This is a good law that will save lives. If it struck down, however, we'll just have to fight even harder in Washington, D.C. "The Arizona law has sparked an even more intense debate about illegal immigration across the nation so any victory for the pro-illegals in court I promise will be short lived," LeBlanc warns.
